The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

The issue of legislation to address sexuality and gender identity discrimination is likely to be raised in the National Human Rights Consultation. The Committee undertaking the consultations is to report by 31 August 2009. The timing of any legislation is a matter for Government.
