#### (118) Program 2.1: Refugee and Humanitarian Assistance

Senator Humphries asked:

1. How many humanitarian visas have been granted out of Indonesia from the caseload of asylum seekers processed by UNHCR?
2. What visas were they given?

*Answer:*

1. The following table shows the number of visas granted in Indonesia from the caseload of asylum seekers processed by UNHCR from 2001 until 26 February 2010 broken down by the visa subclass granted.

<b>Visa subclass</b>	<b>No of visas granted</b>
subclass 200	200
subclass 202	5
subclass 451	230
subclass 449	120
subclass 100	5
Total	560

2. The table above outlines which visas were granted to persons. The visa subclasses granted were:
  - a. Subclass 200 – Refugee visa
  - b. Subclass 202 – Global Special Humanitarian visa
  - c. Subclass 451 – Secondary Movement Relocation (Temporary) visa
  - d. Subclass 449 – Humanitarian Stay (Temporary) visa
  - e. Subclass 100 – Partner visa
