(269) Program 4.2: Onshore Detention Network

Senator Hanson-Young asked:

Following reports of growing unrest in detention centres, what minimum standards of training are all people working in these facilities receiving in mental health training and critical incident management?

Answer.

Mental health training is provided to staff working in places of immigration detention as follows:

- DIAC An 'Introduction to the Mental Health Policies' course, of three hours duration, is conducted in conjunction with the College of Immigration and delivered to Case Management and Regional Management staff. A day long course is also delivered by clinicians from the NSW Institute of Psychiatry, entitled 'Introduction to Mental Health'.
- Serco staff attend training in Understanding Mental Health delivered by a qualified trainer.
- IHMS staff attend a short course to explain key issues embedded within DIAC's three mental health policies.
