## Senator Humphries asked the following question at the hearing on 20 February 2012:

## **Crisis Coordination Centre**

- 1. What was the maximum number of operational staff in the centre from 1 January 2012 to the current date?
- 2. What was the capital cost for the centre's establishment?
- 3. What are the ongoing costs per financial year excluding staffing?
- 4. Will the CCC be affected by the increased efficiency dividend? If so, what areas or programs will be affected? Will CCC staffing budgets be reduced as a consequence of the increase?
- 5. Of the two DLOs deployed to QLD, what has been their period of deployment for this year?
- 6. At whose advice or direction is the CCC upgraded from a Steady State period to a Crisis State?
- 7. From the period of the CCC's launch in September 2010 until the current date, how many incident reports have been released?
- 8. Of these, how many incident reports have been released with information pertaining to the 2012 floods in OLD and NSW?

### The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- 1. The maximum number of operational staff between 1 January and 29 February was 20. (5 rostered shift + 5 day shift + 10 Planning and Support)
- 2. The capital cost for establishing the CCC was \$22.608 million.
- 3. Ongoing operating costs of the CCC, excluding staffing are \$648 000.
- 4. The increased efficiency dividend will not affect the front line services the Department provides to the community.
- 5. Two (2) Liaison Officers were deployed to Queensland from 4-9 February and one (1) to NSW from 16-18 February.
- 6. The Assistant Secretary Crisis Coordination Branch or the rostered Incident Coordinator (outside normal working hours).

- 7. Between 19 September 2010 and 29 February 2012 the Crisis Coordination Centre has issued:
  - Incident Notifications 1436
  - Incident Briefs 267
  - Total = 1703
- 8. In relation to the 2012 Queensland and New South Wales floods the Crisis Coordination Centre has issued:
  - Incident Notifications 5
  - Incident Briefs 36
  - Total = 41
