As at cob 13 February 2012 according to DIAC operational data:

- The number of Irregular Maritime Arrivals (IMAs) accommodated at Villawood Immigration Detention Centre (IDC) was 68.
- The number of Irregular Maritime Arrivals (IMAs) accommodated at Sydney Immigration Residential Housing (IRH) was 26.

As at cob 13 February 2012:

- Six IMAs had been released from Villawood IDC on a bridging visa.
- No clients had been released from Sydney IRH on a bridging visa.

According to DIAC operational data, from 10 February 2011 to cob 13 February 2012:

- There have been 36 IMAs placed into community detention from Villawood IDC and 40 from Sydney IRH
- There have been 88 IMAs released on protection visas from Villawood IDC and 14 from Sydney IRH.
