#### **Question No. 75**

#### Senator Humphries asked the following question at the hearing on 12 February 2013:

- 1. Provide a list of projects that have been funded under this program [Safer Suburbs Program]. Include the location of the program, the cost and a status update (such as project completed or under way).
- 2. How much funding remains in the program? Provide a yearly breakdown. What is committed, and can you provide details of what the funding is committed to?

- 1. The list of projects funded under the Safer Suburbs Program, including their location, cost and status, is **attached**.
- 2. The Safer Suburbs Program has \$5 million remaining in the program, as shown in the table below:
