(AE13/0029) PROGRAM – 1.1: Visa and Migration

Senator Cash (L&CA 39) asked:

Please provide which Visa and subclasses are tracking red and which are tracking amber and the time periods by which they are outside the service delivery standard?

Answer:

The attached table provides processing times for all visa subclasses and the relevant service standards for the period 1 July to 31 December 2012. Service standards may be affected by a range of factors including planning levels for specific visa subclasses, seasonal peaks and, the completeness of applications and the need to undertake additional checks.

A number of Family Migration program subclasses are not meeting service standards, due primarily to demand for places exceeding annual planning levels. Some applicants do, therefore, need to wait for places to become available.

Student visa categories are not meeting service standards due to a number of factors, including the large number of incomplete applications being lodged and the high seasonal workload which places significant strain on available resources.

The Working Holiday category is not meeting service standards due to the time taken for increased integrity checking of the second Working Holiday Visa applications.
