Senator Cash (Written) asked:

Please provide a full list of government departments, not for profit agencies, charity groups etc. that have been approached or have been considered as candidates for housing asylum seekers in community detention and on bridging visas.

Answer:

In the process of expanding the community detention program, the department held community consultation meetings in all capital cities (except Darwin) during late 2010 and early 2011.
