Question No. 191

Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 24 May 2007:

Tribunal tests for registration

- a) What is the average time it takes for the Tribunal in the first instance to finalise registration of an application?
- b) Please provide the Committee with the full range of times that it takes for these applications to be finalised.
- c) What is the workload for these applications?
- i) For the years 2002-03, 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06, how many applications were entered for registration?
- ii) For the years 2002-03, 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06, how many of those were finalised?
- d) Please provide the number of officers who work in this area, including:
- i) Target workload for 2002-03, 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06.
- ii) Actual workload for 2002-03, 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06.

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

a) In 2005/06 the average time to make first instance registration test decisions was 9.1 months. The average time for all registration test decisions was 5.8 months. Overall 77% of decisions were made within 6 months after the application was received for registration testing or re-registration testing.

The Registrar and his delegates decide almost all claimant applications affected by future act notices within the specified statutory period so that these applicants can obtain response rights including the right to negotiate. A consequence of prioritising applications lodged in response to future act notices is that it sometimes takes longer to deal with claimant applications not affected by future act notices.

b) In 2005/06 the quickest registration test decision was made in one day. The longest decision was made 44 months after the claimant application was received. This claimant application was subject to numerous amendments during this period.
