- 2. Of these five visas:
- (a) What countries are the visa-holders from?
- (b) What skill areas are they undertaking their apprenticeship in?
- (c) Which region will they be working in?
- (d) Did they apply for the visa onshore?
- (e) If the visa was applied for onshore what visa did the applicant hold immediately prior to applying for the trade skills training visa?

Answer:

- 1. Yes. At 21 June 2007, one more visa has been granted.

- (a) United Kingdom, Canada, Netherlands, Peoples Republic of China and South Africa.
- (b) Plant mechanic (fitter), electrician, bricklayer, cook and refrigeration and air conditioning mechanic.
- (c) The Wheatbelt (WA), the Kimberley (WA) and Geelong (Vic).
- (d) Four applied onshore.
- (e) All four held a Working Holiday visa subclass 417.
