### **(46) Output 1.1: Migration and Temporary Entry**

Senator Ludwig (L&CA 53) asked:

Can you provide a breakdown of which are primary and secondary (457 visa holders who became permanent residents) in due course? Can you also provide details of how many are aged between 16 and 18 in the primary application, if any? I am not sure whether there is a threshold, but it struck me that you could theoretically employ people aged from 16 to 18.

*Answer:*

The number of people granted a permanent visa in 2006-07 to 31 March 2007 who had last held a Subclass 457 visa, rounded to the nearest 10, is shown in the following table:
