(25) Output 1.2: Refugee and Humanitarian Entry and Stay

Senator Ellison (L&CA 53) asked:

In relation to questions on notice taken for 351s that we have just gone through, can we do the same for 417s.

- (1) What are the current caseloads of those 417/501J visa categories? I will break it down: in the department's initial processing stage, if that makes sense; in the stage of further processing, if there is one; the cases at the minister's office; unassessed cases; and the total of that.
- (2) From 7 December to date, how many have been sent to the minister's office and how many finalised?
- (3) How many bridging visas have been granted while the request for intervention is being finalised?

Answer.

- (1) For the 2007/08 Financial Year, as at 30 May 2008, there were:
 - 1228 requests on hand with the Department either awaiting referral to the Minister or other finalisation
 - of those some 290 requests had undergone preliminary assessment but had yet to be formally assessed against the Ministerial Intervention Guidelines;
 - 410 requests had been referred to the Minister and were undergoing further processing for resubmission; and
 - 450 requests were at the Ministers Office.

The above represents a total of 2088 requests.

(2) Between 7 December 2007 and 6 June 2008, some 1810 requests for intervention under section 417 and 501J were sent to the Ministers office. In the same period some 1195 requests were finalised by the Minister.
