Senator Barnett asked the following question at the hearing on 24 May 2010:

Please provide a breakdown of the costs of building public awareness (during the National Human Rights Consultation).

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

The Australian Human Rights Commission committed \$54,400.00 to building public awareness about human rights during the National Human Rights Consultation.

The Commission's expenditure can be broken down as follows:

Design, printing and distribution of materials	17,342.00
Legal seminars	10,722.00
General seminars	11,939.00
General travel and other costs	14,397.00
TOTAL	54,400.00

The Foundation for Young Australians provided additional funding to the Commission on a fee-for-service basis, to support the engagement of children and young people in the national consultation process. The funding under this agreement amounted to \$35,880.00 and can be broken down as follows:

Design, printing and postage of materials	6,263.00
Travel and seminar costs (all states and territories)	29,617.00
Total	35,880.00
