Senator Colbeck asked the following question at the hearing on 25 May 2010:

The Government has indicated there will be savings of \$18.182m as a result of a decline in illegal foreign fishing, which has in turn resulted in reduced activity relating to apprehensions and detention of illegal foreign fishers as well as a reduction in the cost associated with the towing and destruction of their vessels.

- 1. Can Customs and Border Protection provide further detail on the reason for this cutback?
- 2. What will the efficiencies involve? Less personnel? Less patrols?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- 1. Customs and Border Protection will deliver savings of \$18.2m per year over four years from 2010/11, reflecting a continuation of reduced apprehensions resulting from the success of incountry programs and on water enforcement in managing illegal foreign fishing.
- 2. The efficiencies will be made in the areas of processing and transfer of fishers, transitional accommodation facilities and rapid response to illegal landings none of which involve a reduction in personnel or patrols.
