Senator Humphries (L&C 80) asked:

Take the three or four most common countries of repatriation and provide the most common routes taken for taking people back there.

Answer.

Program information on the number of Irregular Maritime Arrivals (IMAs) since October 2008 indicates that currently the most common countries for removal of IMAs (in descending order) are:

- Sri Lanka;
- Indonesia; and
- Iran.

Clients usually travel on commercial flights. Depending on the travel route for the individual, flights may depart directly from Christmas Island or may travel via a transit point in Australia or Asia.

Examples of flight routes are below:

Recent travel routes to Sri Lanka:

- Christmas Island -> Singapore -> Sri Lanka
- Sydney -> Kuala Lumpur -> Sri Lanka
- Perth > Singapore -> Sri Lanka

Recent travel routes to Indonesia: Christmas Island -> Indonesia Perth -> Indonesia

<u>Recent travel routes to Iran:</u> Perth -> Bangkok -> Doha -> Tehran
