## **Question No. 51**

## Senator Brandis asked the following question at the hearing on 26 May 2011:

**Senator BRANDIS:** No, do not worry about that. Have there been any other incidents at Villawood involving unlawful entrants, other than the riot, to which the Australian Federal Police were called? **Mr Colvin:** The answer to that question is yes.

**Senator BRANDIS:** Can you provide details of those other incidents?

**Mr Colvin:** It depends on the time frame. We were aware of various protest activities at detention centres. I cannot be specific about which ones and when.

**Senator BRANDIS:** It is not core to my line of questioning, so perhaps the easiest thing might be for you to take that one on notice.

Mr Colvin: We will take it on notice.

## The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

Apart from the Villawood incidents on 21 April 2011, the AFP received three separate referrals from the Villawood Immigration Detention Centre, during the period June 2009 – June 2011. These referrals are as follows:

- 1. Referral received from SERCO on 10 May 2011 relating to alleged criminal damage to CCTV cameras. The referral was accepted, and is currently under investigation by the AFP.
- 2. Referral received from DIAC on 11 May 2011 relating to alleged assault of a detainee by a SERCO officer. The referral was accepted, and is currently under investigation by the AFP.
- 3. A referral on 25 May 2011 was received from SERCO. An investigation was conducted. No charges were laid as a result of that investigation.
