## Question No. 52

## Senator Brandis asked the following questions at the hearing on 26 May 2011:

**Senator BRANDIS:** How many buildings were significantly damaged by fire? Can you tell me?

The press reports that it was nine. **Mr Colvin:** Yes, I think it was nine. **Senator BRANDIS:** Out of how many?

**Mr Colvin:** I could not say.

**Senator BRANDIS:** Was it most of the buildings?

**Mr Colvin:** No, I would not say that it was most. It was some critical facilities—a medical centre, kitchen facilities, and the galley-type facilities. I understand most of the accommodation blocks were still there. I do not think 'most' would be the right word, but again I could not be accurate with that.

**Senator BRANDIS:** You might be able to take that on notice.

**Mr Colvin:** DIAC would be much better placed to answer these questions.

**Senator BRANDIS:** These questions have also been asked of DIAC. What we are interested in is getting evidence from all of the relevant witnesses to the event.

Mr Colvin: To answer the question, I will have to ask DIAC.

**Senator BRANDIS:** From a policing point of view, you may assess what they tell you differently from the way they might express it. Does it amount to this: at the time you entered the centre and for some time before that the only significant disorder was the presence of people on the roofs?

Mr Colvin: You describe that as disorder but, yes.

## The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

The disturbance at Villawood Detention Centre took place in the Fowler and Hughes compounds of the Centre, which comprise 35 buildings in total.

The AFP is advised that 4 buildings were damaged and 10 demountables were destroyed during the disturbance.
