Senator Cash (L&CA 12) asked:

To which countries and at what cost have failed asylum seekers who have arrived documented at Australia air and sea ports, been returned?

Answer.

The Department does not have consolidated data for the final destination countries of removees, and those departing on Bridging E visas. Often a client will be removed or will return to their country of nationality.

The individual cost of a removal depends on a wide range of factors including the destination and commercial airfare costs, whether security or other escorts are required (including their airfares, accommodation and allowances) and the types of immediate post-return assistance that may be appropriate.

From 1 July 2010 - 31 March 2011 the average cost for a non-IMA removal was around \$4000. This figure does not include location, detention, case management or review costs.
