Senator Furner (L&CA 32) asked:

Mr Allen: The interview at the airport is undertaken our airport inspectors. If a claim is raised that engages our obligations, information is collected and the claim is referred to an officer from the onshore protection branch here in Canberra, usually a senior officer or a senior delegate, for consideration.

Senator HANSON-YOUNG: How often does this occur? Mr Allen: I can give you some figures for the current year.

Senator HANSON-YOUNG: That would be great.

Mr Allen: For this year, 2012-13, to 30 April there were 47 protection

claimants screened in at Australian airports.

Senator HANSON-YOUNG: How many were screened out?

Mr Allen: I do not have an answer for that. It would be contained within the broader group of people who are interviewed and are then removed from Australia. I would need to take that part of the question on notice.

Answer:

The detailed information sought is not readily available in consolidated form and it would be a major task to collect and assemble it. The considerable resources required to collate the information cannot be justified.
