Mr Bowles: To clarify, I said SES, but it is usually an executive level or an SES. It has been both over the period of time. It is usually and EL2 and in some cases it has been an SES. What is the second part of your question? Senator HANSON-YOUNG: The second part was about the number of people, but Ms Larkins said—

Answer:

At least one senior officer of the Department reviews all enhanced screening findings.

Interviews are conducted by two experienced officers. There are at least two senior officers who are part of enhanced screening. There is a number of support staff who provide support to each element of the enhanced screening. The number of people working on enhanced screening reflects the number of arrivals who undergo enhanced screening.
