Senator Cash (Written) asked:

What was the average processing time for IMAs during the year to date, by age, gender and country of origin?

Answer:

The time taken to undertake relevant processing is subject to variation depending on individual circumstances. Timeframes can be affected by a number of factors including difficulty in satisfactorily determining a client's identity, developments in country information and complexity of processing due to individual circumstances relating to health, character, security or legal matters.

Below is a breakdown by by age, gender and country of origin of the average time in days between arrival and protection visa grant for Irregular Maritime Arrivals who were granted a Protection Visa between 1 January 2013 to 28 May 2013. This includes people who are in immigration detention facilities, in the community under a residence determination and Bridging Visa E holders.
