

## QUESTION TAKEN ON NOTICE

### BUDGET ESTIMATES HEARING: 27 – 28 May 2013

#### IMMIGRATION AND CITIZENSHIP PORTFOLIO

#### **(BE13/0532) PROGRAM – Internal Product**

Senator Humphries (Written) asked:

How cars are owned by each department/agency? Where is the car/s located? What is the car/s used for? What is the cost of each car for this financial year to date? How far did each car travel this financial year to date?

*Answer:*

1) Number of cars owned - 65

2) Location

Offshore: Nauru, Manus Island, Amman, Islamabad, Jakarta, Dubai, Port Moresby, Dili and Manila.

Onshore: Curtin Detention Centre and Christmas Island.

3) Usage of Vehicles

Conduct of immigration activities at Immigration Detention Facilities, transport of DIAC staff or clients, official movements within foreign countries, and to act as emergency service vehicles (fire/ambulance/water tankers).

4) Cost of each car for this financial year to date

The total operating costs (registration, insurance, fuel, servicing, maintenance and repair) of all vehicles is \$113,854. This is categorised into financial year to date expenditure (Australian dollars) of:

- Registration - \$14,949
- Fuel - \$63,126
- Service/Maintenance - \$23,020
- Repairs - \$12,759

5) Distance travelled for each car this financial year to date

The department does not currently have access to the distance travelled for all owned vehicles.

The Department is in the process of establishing a reporting process for Curtin Detention Centre and Christmas Island. These vehicles are managed through a contract with an external service provider.

Excluding vehicles located at Curtin Detention Centre and Christmas Island the average vehicle travel distance financial year to date is 11,156 kilometres.
