- a) Is it correct that a response to the *Modern Day Use of Averments in Customs Prosecutions* was given to the government in May of 2004?
- b) Was the response sent back to the Department for redrafting or any other reason?

If so, when was it sent back to the department?

If so, has a revised response been provided to the government?

- (i) If not, why not? Does the Department intend to provide a response and when will the Department provide one?
- (ii) If so, on what date was it provided to the government?
- (c) What was wrong with the response that was presented to you that was not adequate?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- a) No. The House of Representatives Standing Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs tabled its report *Modern-day usage of averments in customs prosecutions*, on 31 May 2004.
- b) Yes. 12 August 2005.

 - ii) A revised response was provided in November 2005.
- c) The proposed response required amendment to clearly articulate the Government's position.
