**Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 31 October 2005:**

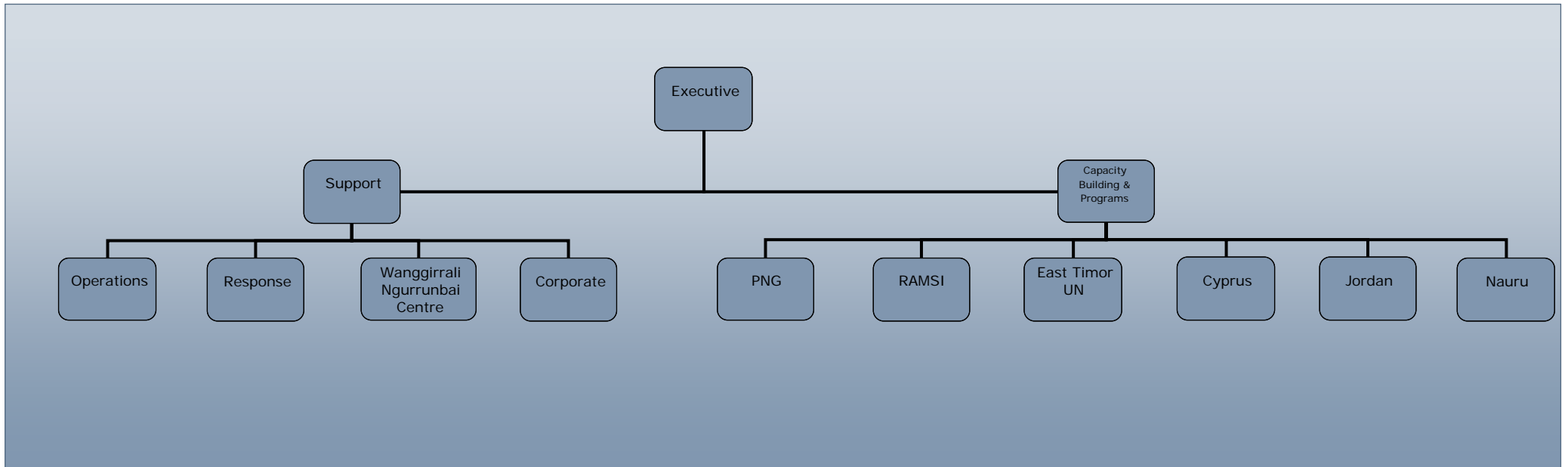
- a) How many officers are assigned to a program under the International Services output?

- c) Please provide an organisational chart for the International Services portfolio and provide the funding that this portfolio received this year, for the previous four years and the projected spending for the next four years.
- d) Could you please provide the funding that each of the following programs receive, including the funding received this year, the funding for the previous four years and the projected funding for the next four years:
  - (i) International Deployment Group
  - (ii) RAMSI
  - (iii) Enhanced Co-operation program to Papua New Guinea
  - (iv) Nauruan National Police Force
  - (v) Jordan International Police Training Centre
  - (vi) UN Mission in support of East Timor
  - (vii) UN Office in Timor Leste
  - (viii) Cyprus – UN Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus
  - (ix) Indonesian Transnational Crime Coordination Centre
  - (x) Philippines Counter-Terrorism Capacity Building Project
  - (xi) Disaster victim identification team
  - (xii) Asian Region Law Enforcement Cooperation program
  - (xiii) Permanent Participation programs mentioned on page 66 of the Annual report
  - (xiv) International training complex
  - (xv) Operations Response Team

- iii) Enhanced Co-operation program to Papua New Guinea - as above;
- iv) Nauruan National Police Force - as above;
- v) Jordan International Police Training Centre – not funded by AFP;
- vi) UN Mission in support of East Timor – as above;
- vii) UN Office in Timor Leste – not funded by AFP;
- viii) Cyprus – UN Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus – the above details the amounts that are provided from AFP base appropriations.
- ix) Indonesian Transnational Crime Coordination Centre – not funded by AFP;
- x) Philippines Counter-Terrorism Capacity Building Project – not funded by AFP;
- xi) Disaster Victim Identification team - this is funded from within the Forensic and Technical portfolio of AFP.
- xii) Asian Regional Law Enforcement Cooperation Team – this is funded from LECP funding as detailed above;
- xiii) Permanent Participation programs as mentioned on page 66 of the AFP Annual Report- these are all funded from LECP funding as detailed above;
- xiv) International Training Complex – does not receive dedicated funding; and
- xv) Operations Response Team – does not receive dedicated funding.
