### (142) Output 1.3: Enforcement of Immigration Law

#### Senator Nettle asked:

- 1. How many residence determinations have been made to date?
- 2. Provide a table of the residence determination made by location, age, gender, nationality, and length previously in a detention centre.

#### Answer:

- 1. Since the 30 June 2005, which was when the *Migration Act 1958* was amended to allow the making of residence determinations, the Minister has used this power to place 82 persons in residence determination arrangements in the community.
- 2. The following tables provide details of these 82 persons by location, age, gender, nationality, and length previously in an immigration detention facility.
