Senator Hurley asked:

Can you provide a list of the targeted community groups for the settlement grant policy?

Answer:

The Settlement Services Target Group under the Settlement Grants Program (SGP) commencing on 1 July 2006 is:

- permanent residents who have arrived in the previous five years either as humanitarian entrants or as family stream migrants with low English proficiency; and
- communities that require assistance to develop their capacity to organise, plan and advocate for services to meet their own needs and which are still receiving significant numbers of new arrivals in the Settlement Services Target Group.

While skilled migrants and their families are not part of the Settlement Services Target Group, to complement regional migration initiatives and in recognition of the additional challenges these entrants may face in settling in regional areas, the dependents of skilled migrants settling in regional areas with low English proficiency are eligible to access SGP services.
