Senator Brandis asked the following question at the hearing on 20 October 2008:

Provide figures on the average length, in terms of judge days required, of the matters that went to trial in the Family Court in 2007-08.

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

The average length, in terms of judge days required for Applications for Final Orders that went to trial in the Family Court of Australia in 2007-08, was as follows:

- 3.4 days for all trials (including matters that settled after trials commenced and those that went to judgment)
- 5.3 days for trials that went to judgment
