## (58) Output 1.5: Detention

Senator Fierravanti-Wells (L&CA 107) asked:

(1) Numbers of people in detention are always bandied around. I would appreciate it if you could provide me with a list since detention was instigated under a previous Labor government (1989). Could you give me a history of detention in this country, including of children.

(2) Could you also tell me where you cannot and for what reason you cannot.

Answer.

(1) and (2)

The following table is based on the average of end of week numbers of adults and children in immigration detention from the 1989-90 financial year to the 2007-08 financial year. Immigration detention can include placement of a person in detention in an Immigration Detention Centre (IDC – since 1989), an Alternative Place of Detention (APOD – since 1989), Immigration Residential Housing (IRH – since 2001), Immigration Transit Accommodation (ITA – since 2007), or Community Detention under a Residence Determination (since 2005).

The figures have been derived following the amalgamation of a number of reporting systems and will vary in a number of instances from previously published data. It is suggested that the figures be used to indicate trends only:
