SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET ESTIMATES HEARING: 17 OCTOBER 2011

IMMIGRATION AND CITIZENSHIP PORTFOLIO

(SE11/0194) Program 2.1: Refugee and Humanitarian Assistance

Senator Cash (L&CA 27) asked:

Has the UNHCR referred any appropriate cases of Iranians, Sri Lankans and Iraqis offshore for consideration under Australia's refugee resettlement program for 2010-2011 and the year to date, and if so: a) how many; b) how many have been granted visas; c) from which posts.

Answer.

The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) have advised that during the 2010–11 program year they referred a total of 1 195 Iraqis, 283 Iranians and 59 Sri Lankans to Australia for consideration under Australia's Humanitarian Program. UNHCR advise that data on referrals for the current (2011–12) program year is not yet available.

The Department does not collect data on referrals and so is unable to identify the number of these referrals which have subsequently led to visa grants.

However, most persons granted Refugee visas have been referred to the Department by the UNHCR. Refer to Table 1 below for the number of refugee visa grants by post to persons born in Iraq, Iran and Sri Lanka.
