# SENATE STANDING COMMITTEE ON LEGAL AND CONSTITUTIONAL AFFAIRS AUSTRALIAN HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION

### **Question No. 2**

### Senator Wright asked the following question at the hearing on 16 October 2012:

**Senator WRIGHT:** Does the commission receive complaints from people in detention regarding their treatment by authorities?

**Prof. Triggs:** It does.

**Senator WRIGHT:** Can you give me a sense of how frequent those sorts of concerns might be raised with the commission—for instance, the number in the last—

**Prof. Triggs:** Historically, as in particularly in the last two or three years, the numbers have been quite high. However, in the last 12 months there has been quite a noticeable drop in those complaints. We think because of increased movement of people from detention into community settlement and that has had what we believe is a very noticeable impact on the number of complaints.

**Senator WRIGHT:** It sounds to me as though you are talking there about the detention of asylum seekers or people coming to Australia. I am also interested in the broader issue of concerns, complaints or grievances raised by people within either mental health institutions or criminal justice institutions in Australia. Do you receive complaints from people in those institutions?

**Prof. Triggs:** We do receive some complaints, but I do not have the numbers or proportion of those relative to other kinds of complaints from detention. I think it is relatively small.

**Senator WRIGHT:** Can I ask you to take on notice that sort of data for the last two years—

**Prof. Triggs:** I will certainly take that on notice.

**Senator WRIGHT:** And I would like to see whether there has been an increase or a drop.

## The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:
