# SENATE STANDING COMMITTEE ON LEGAL AND CONSTITUTIONAL AFFAIRS AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION SERVICE

#### **Question No. 81**

#### Senator Cash asked the following question at the hearing on 16 October 2012:

- a) Can the Department advise the number of IMAs who arrived in Australia who embarked on their final sea journey from Indonesia, Sri Lanka and Malaysia?
- b) Can the Department provide a breakdown of the number of SIEVs and IMAs by province of embarkation in Indonesia for 2011/12, 2010/11 and 2009/10?
- c) Can the Department provide a breakdown of the number of SIEVs and IMAs by province of embarkation in Sri Lanka for 2011/12, 2010/11 and 2009/10?

#### The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

Customs and Border Protection often receives information about maritime people smuggling venture embarkation locations from a range of sources, including irregular maritime arrivals during immigration processing. This information has at times proven accurate and other times it has not. The tables below show the total number of irregular maritime arrivals who arrived in Australia after undertaking their final sea journey from Indonesia and Sri Lanka during the financial years 2009/10, 2010/11 and 2011/12. The total number of arrivals has been broken down to show possible province or location of embarkation where that information has been collected; otherwise an assessed region of location. Separate tables show the irregular maritime arrivals who arrived in Australia after undertaking their final sea journey from Malaysia during the financial years 2009/10, 2010/11 and 2011/12.
