## (SE12/0281) PROGRAM – 2.1: Refugee and Humanitarian Assistance

Senator Cash (written) asked:

Refugee and Humanitarian assistance: How many Christians from the Middle East have been granted a humanitarian or refugee visa in 2011-12? Where were they from? How many have been granted visas out of Syria and Jordan? What about Iraq? What are the planned numbers in 2012-13?

Answer:

During the 2011-12 program year, 867 Christians who were born in the Middle East were granted a humanitarian or refugee visa. Table 1 provides a breakdown of visas that were granted by Post and country of birth.
