Senator Cash (written) asked:

Onshore arrangements - Community Detention: How many people are now in community detention; how many have moved through the system since it was first put in place: please provide these breakdowns by length of time, age, gender and country of origin.

Answer:

As at 15 October 2012, 5,361 people had been approved for community detention. Of these, 1,659 clients were still residing in community detention.

The following tables provide a more detailed breakdown of the 5,361 clients who had been approved for community detention by factors such as age, gender and country of origin.
