Senator Cash (written) asked:

Onshore arrangements - Community Detention: Please provide a full list of government departments, not for profit agencies, charity groups etc. that have been approached or have been considered as candidates for housing asylum seekers in community detention and on bridging visas.

## Answer:

The department held a series of community consultations in all state and territories in relation to the community detention program and the bridging visa program. A wide range of not-for-profit, faith-based and other community organisations received information about the programs and the possibility of assisting to deliver services. An expression of interest process was managed by the Australian Red Cross (ARC) in 2010-2011 which led to the ARC contracting a range of organisations to work with them in delivering community detention services.
