### Senator McEwen asked:

Can you tell me what funding has been set aside for environmental works and measures prior to this latest injection of money?

#### **Answer:**

The Environmental Works and Measures Program was a \$150 million dollar programme originally over a seven year period then extended to eight years with a completion date of 2010/11.

Prior to the Australian Government's injection of \$500 million to the Murray-Darling Basin Commission the funding set aside for the Environmental Works and Measures Program for 2006-07 had not been finalised. It is likely that 2006/07 funding would have been approximately \$11 million.
