Sub-section 59(1) of the *Airports Act 1996* requires that an airport-operator company must ensure that a majority of its directors are either Australian citizens or foreign citizens 'ordinarily resident in Australia'.

Clause 3 of the Schedule to the Act specifies, for purposes of the ownership provisions, when a foreign citizen is ordinarily resident in Australia. A copy of Clause 3 is at **Attachment A**.
