## Dear Senator Sterle

I am writing to clarify answers to questions on notice arising from your Committee's Budget Estimates hearing of 26 May 2009.

The answers provided to questions 53 and 55 included lists of food and agriculture products described as imported from China. These lists were extracted from the AQIS Import Management System (AIMS) and included beef and lamb products. Investigations have shown that these beef and lamb products were in fact imported directly from New Zealand.

The data in AIMS that indicated the beef and lamb products had been imported from China is not correct. The data error occurred because an incorrect country of origin code was entered by an Australian customs broker into the Integrated Cargo System (ICS), which is managed by the Australian Customs & Border Protection Service. The ICS then automatically referred the data to AIMS because quarantine risk material (beef and lamb) had been identified by the quarantine profiles in the ICS. AQIS staff are not able to amend data entered into ICS by brokers, although where they are detected, brokers are requested to correct them.

The anomalies in AIMS data do not in themselves represent any biosecurity risk.

The lists provided in answer to questions 53 and 55 can more accurately be described as extracts from the AIMS, showing food and agricultural product imports during the period 1 March 2009 to 31 May 2009 that have been declared by brokers and importers as originating from China.

I regret any misunderstanding arising from this material and would appreciate you bringing this clarification to the attention of Committee members.
