Dear Sir,

I wish to protest at the campaign in favor of the proposed International Court.

I believe as some others do the I.C.C. States "should there be a conflict between I.C.C. legislator and existing State (national) legislator, the International Law established under I.C.C. and decision of the I.C.C. takes precedence."

It states with advice from the I.C.C. "It should be prudent for States to incorporate all acts defined as crimes into their own national law."

Other points about the I.C.C. persecution they says is "the intentional and severe deprivation of a fundamental right" who will decide this and what are fundamental rights?

I request the Government not accept the statute as presently drafted.

Concern as to what social engineering will be put upon us. It will be a different matter to ignore an I.C.C. decision of fundamental right than an U.N. committee decision
