TERMS OF REFERENCE

The Parliamentary Joint Committee on the Australian Crime Commission under paragraph 55(1)(d) of the *Australian Crime Commission Act 2002* is undertaking an inquiry on recent trends in practices and methods of cybercrime with particular reference to:

- (1) child pornography and associated paedophile activity;
- (2) banking, including credit card fraud and money laundering; and
- (3) threats to national critical infrastructure.

The PJC intends to examine recent trends and any potential limitations on the ACC's ability to perform its duties effectively. The PJC will also examine the adequacy of the existing legislative framework for combating cybercrime and related offences.
