RE – Submission to the Senate Inquiry into the Legislative responses to Recommendations of the Lockhart Review

I wish to make known to the Senate Committee my opinion on this matter as a private citizen.

As the committee would be well aware, the Somatic cell nuclear transfer process recommended within the Lockhart review involves the creation of a new human embryo for the extraction of embryonic stem cells for research. This of course results in the embryo's destruction.

It is my opinion that the creation of human life specifically for experimentation is morally indefensible and has no place within a civilised society.

The fact remains that to date; embryonic stem cell research has failed to deliver one useful medical treatment or cure, despite many years of research and billions of research dollars worldwide.

I believe the faint promises of future medical treatments from embryonic stem cell research are exaggerations, and do not provide the justification necessary for Australia's crossing of such a significant ethical line.

I believe the majority of ordinary Australians share my views.

I advise that in response to Lockhart review, the Senate Committee recommend that no changes be made to the relevant Acts, and that no new legislation be introduced.
