

## **Inhalants Funding round**

- Organisation:** Northern and Far Western Regional Health Service Inc - Aboriginal Health Unit - SA  
**Project title:** Pathway to Intervention and Healing Project  
**Overview:** The facilitation of a weeklong bush camp in various locations, which will include a wide range of activities and will be supervised by Elders, traditional healers and health workers  
**Grant awarded:** \$232,060
- Organisation:** Mount Isa Volatile Substance Misuse Action Group - QLD  
**Project Title:** Family Healing Project  
**Overview:** To implement a 24 month program that utilises a community solution to a community identified need to provide opportunities for identified young people and their families to address the psycho-social issues associated with Long-term/Dependent Volatile Substance (Inhalant) Misuse.  
**Grant awarded:** \$250,000
- Organisation:** Queensland Baptist Care / Glendyne Education and Training Centre - QLD
