I experienced an unexpected pregnancy as a 20 year old. I was given some advise from a biased doctor to consider an abortion, I wasn't looking for different ways that I could end my pregnancy just different ways that I could get support.... well none were forthcoming from her.

Pregnancy Support Centres that value life as opposed to biased organisations such as Family Planning and Children by Choice, offer women and their partners, practical support, counselling and a lot of options that involve support for a woman in a crisis pregnancy, they do not withold information about abortion procedures but do not refer for abortions because their is a host of current research ,as well documented testimonies from women to say abortion actually hurts many women, both physcically and psycholgically.
