4)ix Reproductive Rights

1.1 Preamble

The SAUA respects every woman's right to control her own fertility in a safe way, as she sees fit.

1.2 Platform

- 1.2.1.The SAUA believes that each woman should have access to accurate and detailed information regarding her fertility, and available contraception.
- 1.2.2. The SAUA supports women's right to choose, safe abortion.
- 1.2.3. The SAUA believes that contraception is the responsibility of both men and women

1.3 Action

- 1.3.1.The SAUA will make available to both women and men information regarding fertility and contraception. Moreover, this information will be presented in a way, which makes it clear that contraception is the responsibility of both people.
- 1.3.2. The SAUA will act as a referral service for women wanting to have an abortion or counselling regarding their pregnancy options
- 1.3.3. The SAUA will lobby for the continued improvement of abortion services, fighting against attacks upon the availability of abortion as well as attacks on abortion funding.

The Women's Department is proud to support the *Therapeutic Goods*Amendment (Repeal of Ministerial responsibility for approval of RU486) Bill 2005.

The Women's Department believes the Therapeutic Goods Administration is in the best position both in terms of resources, knowledge and experience to determine the availability and oversee the provision of any therapeutic goods.

The Women's Department does not agree with a law that leaves the availability this resource subject to the personal opinions of one Minister, when all other therapeutic goods are subject to a wide and rigorous assessment.
