I wish to make a submission in support of the Food Standards Amendment (Truth in Labeling - Palm Oil) 2009.

I support the mandatory labeling of palm oil for the following reasons:

- I want to be able to make an informed choice at the shops so I can choose against supporting companies that drive threatening processes that endanger wildlife and wild places.

- I believe that Australia needs to take a stand to drive the market for sustainable palm oil.

- I want to support the future of wild populations of Orangutans before it is too late.

- Having seen footage of the destruction, deforestation and palm oil plantations throughout Indonesia I believe that if something is not done soon about these processes, the biodiversity of flora and fauna as well as the native communities of these areas will be completely and irreversibly devastated.
