I am astounded that any patent office anywhere should see fit to grant a patent on a gene. A gene is a body part like the brain, the liver, the heart or a red cell. How in all conscience can anyone patent a gene, hold a monopoly and make money from it?

It is conceivable that a new method of measuring the activity of a gene might be patentable but not such that it excludes others from measuring the gene activity by another means.

I wish the Senate well in solving this thorny problem, started, it would seem, by others outside A ustralia. Legislation should be amended to ensure free access to all genes some of which are vital to the health and welfare of Australians.
