Re: Inquiry into Health Legislation Amendment (Midwives and Nurse Practitioners) Bill 2009 and two related Bills

I write to express  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{my}}$  concern about the above

bills. I understand that these bills

will enable Medicare funding, access to the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme and

professional indemnity premium support for midwives providing care for women to

give birth in hospital.

Medicare funding for midwifery care is long overdue.

It is not acceptable however to exclude homebirth from this funding and indemnity arrangement. By doing this

Australia is totally out of step with nations such as the United Kingdom, Canada, The Netherlands and New Zealand.

These nations support the rights of women to choose homebirth and fund a registered midwife through their national health scheme. In New Zealand and the U.K women have a legislative right to choose homebirth.

The intersection of this legislation with the national registration and accreditation of health professionals will prevent

homebirth midwives from registering. I believe this to be an unintended consequence and ask that you take steps to include homebirth within the Health

Legislation Amendment (Midwives and Nurse Practitioners) and related Bills.

I support a system where all consumers are treated equally, with the same access to funding and the same insurance protection.

Clinically, I have witnessed again and again the benefits of midwife deliveries. Mothers

are usually empowered to take care of their new born with very little out side

help. This is a saving for Medicare. Post natal depression is rare with home

births because of extended family support. Again this is a saving for Medicare.

Can things go wrong? Yes of course they can. That is what professional indemnity insurance is all about. Mid wives need it, no different than obstetricians.

Private midwives providing home births need cover as well, and should fall under the single umbrella for all midwives. That way

premiums are affordable.

The legislation must cater for home births so that there is real choice for women.
