If this legislation is past, it will take away the safety net, that home birthing parents have access to at present.

A independent midwife becomes part of the family, developing a interment relationship with not only the parents,siblings,extended family but also the unborn child, therefore more able to meet the needs of the mother and baby at the time of the labour and birth, this making home an amazingly safe place to birth.

Indemnity insurance has always been unaffordable to this group of professionals, if this legislation is past they will know longer be able to practice in this way.

This then will take away a democratic right of an Australia citizen to choose a independent midwife as the preferred professional carer.

While this legislation on the surface appears to be a safety net, looking more closely it would seem a very clever way of doing what some have been trying to do for years, that is to stop the practice of home midwifery (to out law/ make illegal independent midwifery) and alternately to take away the rights of a woman to be in control of were and how she chooses to give birth.
