  No we have had all of ours.
- If not, do you have friends/family who will be affected if homebirth is not an option for them? Yes two of our children are wishing to have more children at home with a midwife.
- What about your own children's birthing choices?

That is exactly why I am writing this, because my children are going to be effected by this. I am lucky to have raised four level headed, educated and responsible girls. If this is what is important to them, then this is very important to me.

- How do you think an absence of homebirth and independent midwifery services might impact on your community?
  - It will mean that not every woman will have the right to choose where they have their baby, and who they want there to support them.
- Will your local hospital be likely to provide a homebirth program?

Our local hospital was closed down and our birthing services have been gone for a long time. Women would have to travel 40 minutes to the nearest hospital which would mean that people in my town could not homebirth there.

- Do you live a long way from mainstream maternity care?
  - 40 minutes
- If an independent midwife assists you prenatally, or provides lactation consultancy, or post-birth support, or is mysteriously present during your birth anytime after July 2010, then they could face legal action (if they're caught). What do you think about that?
   Stupid and irresponsible.
- If you with-hold information about a midwife who's still practicing unregistered, you could be legally liable. How do you feel about that?
