I am writing to express my views regarding the aged pension. I retired after a 45 yr career of Nursing, at the age of 66 yrs. I am appalled to find that pensioners and the disabled have such a poor amount to live on, \$13,000 a year and still pay the GST on every item we purchase. In 1988 Superannuation was brought in. Sadly too late for Baby Boomers like myself. The small amount of Superannuation I paid off on my home, was taxed while you cannot it while it was being held in a Super Fund and again when you retired in a lump sum. I am pretty good at managing on a small income, having lost my late husband at 46 yrs of age, and bringing up four Australian children on a Nurses pay. I am also a British Child Migrant, today with the cost of food rising, petrol and other costs. A single aged Pensioner gets \$530 Dollars per fortnight; quite often after paying telephone Electricity accounts trying to run a small car, etc. one has only \$120 or less sometimes to live on. John Howard has just accepted a \$20,000 dollar pay increase, this has given him a pay increase of twice the amount I get to live on. Like many others can no longer afford what the cost is too high, even the humble pies. Sausages have increased in price. Some fruit is too expensive. Australia is a Rich Country. But the elderly are treated like 2nd class citizens after all the years we've

Wanted, paid our taxes, and brought up our kids  
without the amount of Money Being paid for Child  
Care, pregnancy Bonuses and Very Small Allowance  
of Child endowment. We are living like Paupers  
It is a national disgrace, that the elderly get  
pushed to the Back of Waiting lists when needing  
receptions etc. I did write to John Hancor  
who was too Busy his letter from his Secretary  
to tell me. This is the Man who expects me and  
thousands of other elderly Pensioners & disabled to vote  
for him, when he doesn't have our any interest-  
in our health and Welfare. I am a Labor  
Supporter and have been all my working years.  
Federal Labor Leader Kevin Rudd "uncle to me"  
in answer to a letter I wrote him regarding the above  
Concerns, he suggested I wrote to the Senate inquiry.
