Re: Submission

As my wife and I are both aged pensioners I would like to make my submission to the Inquiries. To begin with I would like to thank Mr. Rudd for initiating the Inquiry and the PM for supporting it. The following are my submissions:-

- (01) As the base pension has not been increased for a long time it must be increased to 1/2 of the maximum single income of the middle Australians. To relate the pension to 1/4 of the maximum single income of the middle Australians is no longer viable. People's wages have surged higher and higher and the cost of things has shot up through the roof. Therefore the pension must be increased to a comfortable label.
- (02) The prices of all the basic items such as meat, eggs, fruits, milk and bread etc have increased about 7 folds but not the pension, hence it got to increase too.
- (03) The cost of petrol per barrel in 1988 was \$9:00 and the cost of the same petrol is now \$71:11 (03/07/07) a barrel- about 8 times higher. - (06) All the workers of the entire country but the pensioners have been getting tax cuts over and above their annual increments and cost of living adjustments, therefore the pensioners must now get a rise in their pensions.
